I received your contact information from a colleague in our office. I am reaching out to you regarding a project we are working on at 7801 Computer Ave in Bloomington, MN. As part of the City review process, they are requesting a letter be provided from the MPCA stating whether a sanitary extension/modification permit is/is not required. The project proposes the realignment of the existing 10" sanitary service to accommodate the building addition as well as a new service to the addition. All work is related to the private sanitary sewer system on Seagate's property.

- Existing conditions plan showing the existing survey information.
- City GIS map showing the layout of the public and private sanitary sewer onsite.
